



LNG Canada recognizes that the development of a skilled workforce today, is an essential element of the future success of the LNG industry in British Columbia. To engage in the skilled trade opportunities opening up over the next decade, LNG Canada will provide support to British Columbians in their training needs.

## The development of a skilled journeyperson requires engagement, training and work that spans several years and involves many stakeholders.

For that reason, LNG Canada is committed to supporting schools, communities, workers, employers, and training providers, as they each contribute to that development. From middle school, to secondary, through attachment to employment and sponsorship into apprenticeship training, to trade qualification and even upgrades, LNG Canada will be lending its support through its Workforce Development Program.

The cornerstone of the Workforce Development Program will be a \$1,000,000 **LNG Canada Trades Training Fund**, designed specifically to support apprenticeship and industry training.

More than 85% of construction companies in BC have fewer than 10 employees and LNG Canada also recognizes the potential impact on these companies when the job opportunities arise in the LNG sector. LNG Canada believes that this investment would not only increase the number of qualified skilled trade persons in BC for future projects, it would also benefit those contractors who currently sponsor apprentices. LNG Canada wants to help these employers build the workforce of tomorrow through funding their apprentices.

## The \$1,000,000 LNG Canada Trades Training Fund is developed to:

- 1. Support employers, particularly small to medium enterprises that employ, sponsor and train apprentices in the construction and related trades.
- 2. Support and increase apprenticeship training and advance existing apprentices towards completion.
- 3. Support workforce development and increase the number of skilled British Columbian journeypersons available to work in the trades.



Working collaboratively with the BC Industry Training Authority, BC's colleges and training providers, employers, labour providers and workers, the fund will support tuition and related costs for construction and related trades.

The LNG Canada Trades Training Fund can be accessed by employers on behalf of their apprentices. Preference for funding decisions will be given to apprenticeship training; however consideration will also be given to foundation training where it includes level one apprenticeship and, specialized training for employees where such training is specific to the LNG sector demand trades.

In all cases, funding decisions will be determined by LNG Canada and/or their designate. All approved funding will be made directly to the school or training facility, not to the employer or employee.

The LNG Canada Trades Training Fund will be administered through the BC Construction Association on behalf of LNG Canada. For applications or more information please visit www.bccassn.com.
